## 4. First-aid Measures

#### Description of first-aid measures.

#### General advice.

Move victim to a safe isolated area. Immediate medical attention is required. Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice.

#### Inhalation.

Move to fresh air. Apply artificial respiration if victim is not breathing. Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice.

Skin contact.

Wash off immediately with soap and plenty of water. Remove all contaminated clothes and shoes. Remove

#### Notes to physician.

Treat symptomatically. Smallest quantities reaching the lungs through swallowing or subsequent vomiting may result in lung edema or pneumonia.

# 5. Fire-fighting Measures

## Extinguishing media.

#### Suitable extinguishing media.

Use:. Dry powder. Alcohol-resistant foam. Carbon dioxide ( $CO_2$ ). Water may be used to cool and prevent the rupture of containers that are exposed to the heat from a fire.

#### Extinguishing media which shall not be used for safety reasons.

Water may be unsuitable for extinguishing fires.

#### Special hazards arising from the substance or mixture.

Vapors may travel to areas away from work site before igniting/flashing back to vapor source. Thermal decomposition can lead to release of irritating and toxic gases and vapors. Most vapors are heavier than air. Vapors may spread along ground and collect in low or confined areas (sewers, basements, tanks). Vapors may travel to source of ignition and flash back. Possible formation of carbon oxides, nitrogen oxides, and hazardous organic compounds. Air/vapor mixtures may explode when ignited. Containers may explode when heated.

## 6. Accidental Release Measures

#### Personal precautions.

Avoid contact with skin, eyes and clothing. Ensure adequate ventilation, especially in confined areas. All equipment used when handling the product must be grounded. Eliminate all ignition sources (no smoking, flares, sparks or flames in immediate area). Wear protective gloves/clothing and eye/face protection. Stop all work that requires a naked flame, stop all vehicles, stop all machines and equipment that may cause sparks or flames. Do not breathe vapors or spray mist. Avoid exceeding of the given occupational exposure limits (see section 8). Thoroughly decontaminate all protective equipment after use.

#### Advice for emergency responders.

#### Environmental precautions.

## <u>Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up.</u> Methods for Containment.

Absorb with earth, sand or other non-combustible material and transfer to containers for later disposal. Prevent further leakage or spillage if safe to do so. Pick up and transfer to properly labeled containers. Clean contaminated surface thoroughly. Ground and bond containers when transferring material. Take precautionary measures against static discharges. Use personal protective equipment. Remove all sources of ignition.

#### Methods for cleaning up.

Prevent further leakage or spillage if safe to do so. Keep away from open flames, hot surfaces and sources of ignition. Keep in suitable and closed containers for disposal. All equipment used when handling the product must be grounded. Keep combustibles (wood, paper, oil, etc) away from spilled material. Ventilate the area. Use personal protective equipment as required. Shut off ignition sources; including electrical equipment and flames. Clean contaminated objects and areas thoroughly while observing environmental regulations. #### Advice on safe handling.
